You must be 16 years or older. The cost is \$390 per person which will be covered by the Mission/Outreach Pillar. We will be partnering with local organizations to meet ongoing needs in the community serving Benton Harbor. We will be serving all or part of the week at a food shelf, clothing distribution center, or assisting with painting, cleaning, or simple repair projects. If you are interested or have any questions or want more details, contact Renae.

Some of our recent commitments are supporting financially to help pay \$50 per senior high young people attending Silver Birch retreat in Feb. and second to help pay 2/3's of \$390 per person attending Camp Manitoqua.

We are also supporting the two Haiti groups until September with \$200 per month unless we agree to go to go larger. We are going to revisit this around this time next year,

Also, we are planning on a 2023 mission crop this year growing corn on 47 acres. We would like to thank Ron & Ann Mulder, and Wilfred, Noel, Nathan and Derek VandeSlunt got the opportunity to rent their land for this project. We are currently working on securing corn seed donations.

The committee is always open to mission minded opportunities.


