Pastor's Notes

The world is not quiet. The world is raging with conflict. Wars, rumors of wars, economic uncertainty, social unrest, and global political controversy abound— as it has always been. There is nothing new under the sun. That there is conflict should not surprise us, but it often does. It especially surprises people in the world. As Christians, we know that conflict will always exist in this fallen world because this world is filled with fallen, sinful people—and sinful people have a tendency to sin and create conflict. So, why does conflict surprise so many? Many people expect that the world in its present state should be at peace, that everyone should just get along, and that everyone and every nation should coexist in perfect harmony at all times and in all circumstances no matter the differences in religious, sociocultural, ethical, or political views. People are naive.

People want peace even though it has rejected the Prince of Peace, and people cry for peace even though it has declared truth to be relative. People love to talk about peace, but in truth, they have no idea what real peace is or how it is achieved. Many people think that peace is based on compromise, but Christians know that authentic peace is based on truth—truth that is relentlessly stubborn, dogmatic, and unwavering. During the time of the Reformation, Martin Luther declared: "Peace if possible. Truth at all costs." He spoke truth. As Christians, we know that we cannot have peace in spite of the truth and that true peace comes only because of the truth. Negotiated peace founded on compromised truth will only delay conflict, not eliminate it. History bears this truth repeatedly.

The only hope for true, lasting peace in this world is for people to be reconciled to the God of peace who gives peace to all who have been born from above by the Spirit of peace. For it is only when God has conquered a rebellious human heart—a heart that rages with conflict, anxiety, and despair —that that person will be at peace and be able to maintain the spirit of unity in the bond of peace in their hearts, homes, and churches as they await the return of the Prince of Peace, Jesus Christ.

So, do you know the Prince of Peace? If you do not know Him, there will be nothing new under the sun for you in 2024. Conflict, and not peace, will be your norm. May you know the peace, the Prince of Peace in 2024.

Renae's Thoughts

1 Thessalonians 5:16–18

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

Many of us feel uncomfortable talking to strangers. How much more awkward might it feel talking to God. We should be in prayer continually. But when we truly have a relationship with our Savior, just like with any other relationship in our lives, it needs to be a two-way conversation. We spend a lot of time lifting our prayers up but often we don't take the time to listen, to really listen to God responding back to our prayers.

It can be so challenging to hear God in our hearts. He has to speak pretty loud to be heard above all the ruckus in our lives. It's no wonder we can't hear him.

God speaks clearly in many people's hearts, and depending on where we're at, we do have the ability to understand him. Christians who really have a close relationship with God feel they need to turn off the or walk away from all the noise around them. When life is so loud and there's so much input, we can get disconnected from God because we can't hear him clearly.

We all need to get alone in the quiet with him. We need to be still and just listen. Being alone with God can relax you and it makes Him happy to be alone with you too.

We need to believe that he wants to speak to us. So many of us question if we are hearing the voice of God or if that is just our own imagination taking over our thoughts. God talks to us in many ways.

- 1. He is never going to make it too hard for you. If you're struggling to make choices He will speak to you but it will be something you can actually accomplish.
- 2. He does not want you to take the easy way out. Example: God is not going to tell someone to stay home from school when you did not study for their test. Natural consequences are some-times how he lets us learn.
- 3. It is never going to contradict something Jesus said. God's voice is often personal. When in doubt, look it up.
- 4. It will make sense. God's voice brings clarity, not confusion. He knows what you're able to process and what you're not.
- 5. It will help, not hurt. God doesn't give advice that is more hurtful than helpful.
- 6. It brings peace. When you pray, you should feel comforted after a while, even if the situation is tense.
- 7. Sometimes the answer comes as something that we would have never thought of. It's like a revelation that makes us say, "Wow! I could surely NOT have thought of that!"
- **8.** It Lasts. What God tells us tends to stick with us. Things that you imagine go away. God's word stays in our heart. It helps us in some way that we just can't forget.

Many of us talk to God. Listening to him is a skill that many of us have to work on. We should never get discouraged because we need to remember that he ALWAYS hears us and really enjoys hearing from us. Talk to God like a real friend and then listen. Really listen to what He is telling you.


